Livestock Department Entry Information

Entries can be made the day of the exhibition or sent by mail prior to Saturday, Aug. 27. Mail entry information to Livestock Superintendent Larry Hawkes, P.O. Box 437, Lincoln, ME 04457.

- All animals must be registered under the owner's name.
- Be sure to read general rules and regulations, health sections and time table.
- The livestock superintendent reserves the right to accept or reject any entry made, and also reserves the right to interpret any statement or rule made in this book.

Livestock Department Rules and Regulations

1. Entries close at 11am on Saturday.
2. Exhibitors are limited to available space.
3. Judging of entries will be on Saturday.
4. The judges reserve the right to accept or reject any entries.
5. All entries must meet the health requirements for exhibition of the State of Maine.
6. All decisions of the judges are final.
7. Feed, bedding and care is to be provided by the owners, which includes "cleaning out."

Touching Animals at the Fair (PLEASE READ!)

When you attend an agricultural fair a large part of the positive experience comes from seeing and being around animals up close. Particularly for kids, it is fun to see, pet and even hold some of the animals. But, when you leave the animals it is VERY IMPORTANT to wash your hands. Wash them well. In recent years we have learned of more and more occurrences of diseases being transmitted between animals and humans - especially with kids. Children often put their hands near their faces, in their mouths, etc. and this can hasten infection.

Enjoy the animals - but be smart and safe. Always wash your hands when leaving an animal area. DO NOT EAT FOOD around the animals. Make certain that your kids wash their hands. We have hand sanitizer all around the grounds but especially in the barn and food areas.



Seed Swap

No. This doesn't mean that you and the old man take a bite of watermelon and then "swap seeds" (wink wink). This is an honest to goodness chance to bring in your extra seeds and trade 'em for some new seeds for your garden. We will have a table or two in the exhibit hall available for anyone who would like to bring in, or take, some extra seeds. The seeds (or plants) should be clearly marked as to what they are. Also, the year the seeds were harvested (if known).

Seeds and plants will be free for the taking. Please take only what you need or can use. Leave a few for others to share and enjoy. Sharing seeds can be a fun way to bring your gardens some diversity. Access to the seed/plant swap will be during normal exhibit hall hours.

Pavilion / Facility Rental

The height clearance is 7'8" and the width is 11.5' Anything larger we could accommodate as outside storage. We also offer outside camper/RV Storage for \$150.00. 
To any grange not placing in the first three places, a gratuity of \$25.00 will be paid.

If desired, a few plants or flowers may be used to add to the general attractiveness of the exhibit, but they will not be judged.

Scoring for Grange exhibits is as follows:

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| 1. Quality of products displayed | 200 points | 5. Originality of theme | 150 points |
| 2. Quantity and distribution of products | 50 points | 6. Adequate labeling of exhibit, including name | 100 points |
| 3. Variety of agricultural products | 150 points | 7. Bible and Grange | 100 points |
| 4. General appearance of exhibit as a whole | 150 points | | |
